WHO WE ARE

Special Learning Center (SLC) has been dedicated to enhancing the lives of babies & children with special needs in our community since 1985. SLC is deeply committed to providing the best therapy, care, education, and support to these children with disabilities, and we firmly believe that every child, regardless of their abilities or challenges, deserves the opportunity to thrive and reach their full potential.

Today, Special Learning Center has grown to serve more than 900 children annually from 11 Central Missouri counties and 23 area school districts. During the past 38 years, the organization has helped open the doors of opportunity for thousands of children and their families. The need for our services continues to grow.

- 1604 childern served in Early Childhood Special Education classrooms.

SLC and The Community

The new building will be a sanctuary of inclusivity and growth. It will feature state-of-the-art facilities and equipment, specially trained staff, and a nurturing environment that allows children with special needs to develop essential life skills, experience a quality education, and participate fully in the world around them. The impact of this project will extend far beyond our organization—it will enrich the lives of the children we serve and their families, and it will continue to strengthen the entire community.

The impact of Special Learning Center's new facility is multifaceted and will affect more than improve the lives of the children and families we directly serve. Having space to work with additional healthcare providers in the community will extend our ability to provide more comprehensive and

specialized treatment. A larger space increases our collaborative efforts with other educational professionals. The presence of a larger facility will raise awareness about children with disabilities and promote a culture of inclusion.



CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

Presently, our capacity is stretched thin, leaving us unable to adequately accommodate all children with disabilities. However, Special Learning Center purchased a spacious 31,000 square foot facility situated at 905 Weathered Rock Road in Jefferson City. This facility is slated for a comprehensive remodeling project tailored specifically to meet the diverse needs of our children. With the development of our new campus, we anticipate doubling the footprint of our current facility located on Fairgrounds Road. Funds from the Small Steps, Mighty Strides Campaign will allow SLC to:

- Expand the number of classrooms in our Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE) program.
- Double the number of children served in Childcare (and eliminate the existing waiting list.)
- Provide state-of-the-art Therapy Services in a dedicated clinic (and eliminate the existing waiting list.)
- Allow space for a community room and resource center for our Family Support program.
- Open an After School & Summer Program for school age children with special needs.

The new SLC campus will include a main facility for early childhood special education classes, childcare program, school age rooms, family support program space and education therapy rooms. An adjacent building will contain the medical-based, pediatric therapy clinic as well as a gross motor skills gymnasium space.





Over the past three decades, Special Learning

Road. With our forthcoming state-of-the-art facility, expanded space, and a bolstered team of dedicated professionals, we are poised to extend our impact to even more children. Our mission remains steadfast: to help children with special needs reach their maximum potential.
